Respect boundaries.

"When the boys grew up, Esau was a skillful hunter, a man of the field, while Jacob was a quiet man, dwelling in tents. ²⁸Isaac loved Esau because he ate of his game, but Rebekah loved Jacob. ²⁹Once when Jacob was cooking stew, Esau came in from the field, and he was exhausted. ³⁰And Esau said to Jacob, 'Let me eat some of that red stew, for I am exhausted!' ³¹Jacob said, 'Sell me your birthright now.' ³²Esau said, 'I am about to die; of what use is a birthright to me?' ³³Jacob said, 'Swear to me now.' So he swore to him and sold his birthright to Jacob. ³⁴Then Jacob gave Esau bread and lentil stew, and he ate and drank and rose and went his way. Thus Esau despised his birthright." (Genesis 25:27-34 ESV)

Equip don't enable.

"Now therefore, my son, obey my voice as I command you. ⁹Go to the flock and bring me two good young goats, so that I may prepare from them delicious food for your father, such as he loves. ¹⁰And you shall bring it to your father to eat, so that he may bless you before he dies.' ¹¹But Jacob said to Rebekah his mother, 'Behold, my brother Esau is a hairy man, and I am a smooth man. ¹²Perhaps my father will feel me, and I shall seem to be mocking him and bring a curse upon myself and not a blessing.' ¹³His mother said to him, 'Let your curse be on me, my son; only obey my voice, and go, bring them to me.'" (Genesis 27:8-13 ESV)

Liberate don't manipulate.

"So Jacob served seven years for Rachel, and they seemed to him but a few days because of the love he had for her.²¹Then Jacob said to Laban, 'Give me my wife that I may go in to her, for my time is completed.'²²So Laban gathered together all the people of the place and made a feast.²³But in the evening he took his daughter Leah and brought her to Jacob, and he went in to her...²⁵And in the morning, behold, it was Leah! And Jacob said to Laban, 'What is this you have done to me? Did I not serve with you for Rachel? Why then have you deceived me?'²⁶Laban said, 'It is not so done in our country, to give the younger before the firstborn. Complete the week of this one, and we will give you the other also in return for serving me another seven years.²⁷Complete the week of this one, and we will give you the other also in return for serving me another seven years.' ²⁸Jacob did so, and completed her week..." (Genesis 29:20-23, 25-28 ESV)

Let go, don't hold on.

"Now Jacob heard that the sons of Laban were saying, 'Jacob has taken all that was our father's, and from what was our father's he has gained all this wealth.' ²And Jacob saw that Laban did not regard him with favor as before. ³Then the Lord said to Jacob, 'Return to the land of your fathers and to your kindred, and I will be with you.'" (Genesis 31:1-3 ESV)

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven...⁵a time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;⁶a time to seek, and a time to lose..." (Ecclesiastes 3:1, 5-6 ESV)

Follow, obey, and trust Jesus.

"Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. ⁴Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. ⁵Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, ⁶who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, ⁷but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. ⁸And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."
