Small Group Discussion Guide

For the week of November 20 - 26, 2022

Main Thought and Scriptures:

The holiday season is a time of joy for many and a struggle for others. Depression, loneliness, and even suicides spike during the holidays. Christians are called to live beyond their walls to make a difference in the lives of others. The problem is that many of us build walls that keep other people out. During Jesus' day, the religious leaders or Pharisees were infamous for being judgmental and self-righteous, scorning people who were not like them. When Jesus reached out to a notorious sinner Zacchaeus, they couldn't understand why He would befriend such a man. If we are not careful, we can become modern Pharisees who build walls between ourselves and the world He has called us to reach.

"Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. ²A man was there by the name of Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was wealthy. ³He wanted to see who Jesus was, but because he was short he could not see over the crowd. ⁴So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree to see him, since Jesus was coming that way. ⁵When Jesus reached the spot, he looked up and said to him, 'Zacchaeus, come down immediately. I must stay at your house today.' ⁶So he came down at once and welcomed him gladly. ⁷All the people saw this and began to mutter, 'He has gone to be the guest of a sinner.' ⁸But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, 'Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.' ⁹Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. ¹⁰For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.'" (Luke 19:1-10 NIV)

"You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. ¹⁶In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14-16 NIV) Pearlside exists to reach the unreached and to make disciples by planting congregations and churches in every community. To do this, each of us must live beyond our own walls and love and serve people outside the walls of the Church.
